- Once you are off the course, head back to the clubhouse and you check out all the silent auction items and find yourself a seat in the banquet room.

- Raffle and Silent Auction will be open until 9:00pm

9:00 Silent Auction and Raffle closes and winners announced


All players will tee off at every hole. Men will tee off from the WHITE tee box. Ladies will tee off from the GREY/SILVER tee box.

Once all players have teed off, the team decides which drive is the best. From there, all members of the team place their golf balls where the chosen drive ended up. All balls must be placed in the same condition as the shot. IE - Hazard, Bunker or rough. With ALL team members playing a second shot from this spot. Each team member MUST contribute a minimum of 2 tee shots during the round. Including the Par 3's. KEEP IN MIND THE MAXIMUM SCORE ALLOWABLE IS DOUBLE BOGEY. So if your team makes it to the score of double bogey and still has yet to putt out, to keep up the pace of play we ask that you pick up your balls, mark the double bogev score and continue onto the next hole. From these second shots, one shot is chosen as the best, and all play a third shot from there - and so on until the ball is holed. Each team returns ONE score for each hole and the team with the lowest score for the round wins! There are also Mulligan coupons, and Putting Strings available for purchase at the registration table, and they will be driven around for sale throughout the tournament to help you along the way as well. For the "special" or fun holes, there are some optional and some mandatory. They are noted in this booklet along with the rules for each with the hole. The rules for the mandatory "fun" holes are listed in this booklet next to the hole.

HOCKEY TRIVIA TID-BITS

Q: What is a hockey puck made of?

A: Modern hockey pucks are made of rubber that is vulcanized – a process that heats and hardens rubber into the small disks you'll be using to dangle the defense and go top shelf. A hockey puck produced for a game measures 1" thick and 3" in diameter. The dimensions of a puck are standard, but how much the puck weighs can vary. An official black hockey puck weighs in at 5.5-6 oz. The blue puck used for U7 & U9 weighs in at 4 oz.

Q: How did the hockey puck get its name?

A: No one knows for sure where the puck got it's name, but a couple of theories have risen to the top. One is that the puck was named after the character "Puck" in William Shakespears A Midsummer's Night Dream. Another holds that the word's etymology gave the puck it's name: some people believe the word comes from the sport of hurling and could derive from the Scottish Gaelic puc or the Irish poc, meaning to poke, punch, or deliver a blow.

FEMALE HOCKEY TRIVIA TID-BITS

Q: When did women's hockey start?

A: The first women's ice hockey league was organized in Quebec in 1900. The first women's ice hockey tournament took place in Banff, AB in 1906. The first Women's World Hockey Tournament was held at Centennial Arena in North York, ON in 1987. And in 1998 Women's Hockey was introduced into the Olympics Games.

Q: Which NHL team was the first to have a female player?

A: The Tampa Bay Lightning – in 1992 Manon Rheaume tried out for the Tampa Bay Lightning. This was the first time a female player tried out for an NHL game. She played in two preseason games. She also played for Canada's women's hockey team in the 1990s.
